## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Today's prelude, offertory and postlude are compositions from the Baroque period: The prelude and postlude contain the cantus firmus, or hymn tune, in the pedals. This was a compositional convention of the time. This organ music is highly contrapuntal, meaing that there are independent voices instead of melody with accompaniment, the latter being what would have been the style in later centuries.
