Human trafficking is a modern day form of slavery. 80% of victims are women and children, trafficked primarily for sexual exploitation and forced labor - even here in the U.S. Sister Clare Nolan, keynote speaker, has been an advocate for the rights of women and girls through extensive social work with adolescents and families as the Sisters of the Good Shepherd representative to the United Nations' Economic and Social Council.
