At Christ Church, SOS means Sundays of Sharing, a few Sundays during Lent when the Board of World Fellowship (BWF) asks the congregation to consider making a special gift for outreach. During SOS this year, you will hear from representatives of some organizations Christ Church supports through BWF: NY Theological Seminary's program at Sing Sing Prison; the Lambi Fund, which works with communities in Haiti; and Habitat for Humanity. SOS funds are used by BWF to supplement money it receives from the Christ Church budget; unlike budgeted funds, SOS can be carried over each year, so BWF sets some of that money aside for emergencies. For example, at the next BWF meeting, we will be considering how to respond to the unfolding disaster in Japan. Please contact BWF if you want more information about outreach at Christ Church.
