At Christ Church, SOS means Sundays of Sharing, a few Sundays during Lent when the Board of World Fellowship (BWF) asks the congregation to consider making a special gift for outreach. SOS funds are used by BWF to supplement money it receives from the Christ Church budget. Unlike budgeted funds, SOS moneys can be carried over each year, so some is set aside so Christ Church can respond to emergencies, like the unfolding disaster in Japan, while some money is used to support non-profit organizations that strive to make a positive difference in areas bowed down by poverty, war and injustice.
