Board of World Fellowship: At Christ Church, SOS means Sundays of Sharing, a few Sundays during Lent when the Board of World Fellowship (BWF) asks the congregation to consider making a special gift for outreach. SOS funds are used by BWF to supplement money it receives from the Christ Church budget. Unlike budgeted funds, SOS moneys can be carried over each year, so some is set aside so Christ Church can respond to emergencies, while some money is used to support non-profit organizations that strive to make a positive difference in areas bowed down by poverty, war and injustice. You will find a bulletin board in the hallway leading to the sanctuary where you will find updated information on BWF activities. Nicaragua donations: Small boys' clothing, small women's shoes: Looking ahead to the Saturday, May 5 PeaceWorks container shipment to Nicaragua, we have a request from Inhijambia, our partner organization, for boys' clothing and women's shoes in small sizes. In general, Nicaraguans are small people. Since the malnourished boys in Phase I of the Inhijambia program are way too skinny for XXL t-shirts, shorts, and pants, let's see if we can gather some used but still wearable summer-weight clothing for boys aged 6 to 12. And for the young women in Inhijambia's Phase II, shoes in small sizes would be welcome donations. These active schoolgirls live on unpaved streets and wear out a lot of shoe leather. Sizes in greatest demand are women's 6 through 8. Gently worn sneakers, oxfords, sandals, and other practical flat-heeled shoes are highly prized. You can save your donations until the May 5 shipment date, or turn them in early if it's more convenient.
