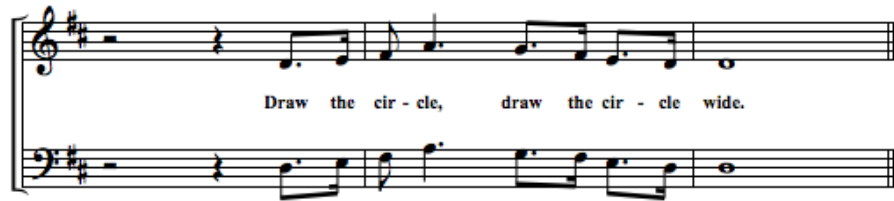

### **Fundraiser to paint bricks to line the entrance to Cornerstone School/Christ Church, Sunday, June 9th from 10:30-11:30:**

Hey everyone, my name is Connor Murray and I am a sophomore at the Summit High School. This coming September, I will be renovating and re-landscaping the Cornerstone School entrance of the church as part of my Eagle Scout Project.

Details of the project include repainting the railings, planting boxwoods and flowerbeds, and installing wooden flower boxes along the walls. It has been a tradition at the Cornerstone School for the children to paint and decorate bricks.

As the last part of the project, I plan to take these decorated bricks and line the walkway to the school entrance with them, and inlay them into the new flowerbeds. However, I do not have enough bricks to line the entire walkway. To fundraise my project, **I will be holding a brick decorating workshop for church families after today's service at 10:30 in the art room upstairs.** Children and adults will be able to paint and decorate bricks to their liking, and

they will become a permanent part of the new garden outside of the church. The cost to paint each brick will be \$15, and all proceeds will go directly into funding the project. All materials will be provided, just come up to the art room directly after the service. Thank you so much for your support.
