



For the 64th PeaceWorks container shipment to Nicaragua we are launching a new, relaxed collection approach: bring your boxed donations **NOW**, and **through Saturday**, **September 28**, to the **church basement**. From the kitchenette near Chuck's office, follow the "Nicaragua donations" signs to the **special storage area below Lile Hall**, and leave your boxes of donations there. **What to donate** to Inhijambia, our partner organization in Nicaragua?

Gently used, presentable items: Summer-weight clothing, shoes, and swimwear for girls age 0-16 and boys age 0-12. Toys and games that do NOT require knowledge of English. Baseball, soccer, and volleyball equipment. School supplies, including book bags, pens, pencils, spiral notebooks, composition books. Sheets, pillowcases, towels. Iron, electric mixer, blender, other small appliances. Flatware, other unbreakable kitchen items. Lightweight fabric and sewing notions. Gardening tools. Electronic keyboard, guitar, recorder, small percussion instruments, music stands.

Note: PeaceWorks is trying to empty its storage rooms for this shipment, so **please no bicycles or bulky furniture** this time.

How to pack your donations: Tightly! Banana boxes from the supermarket are strong and excellent for packing. Don't write the contents on the box; instead, attach a removable list. Each box will eventually be tagged and inventoried with a special code to discourage pilfering. The girls and boys at Inhijambia anticipate each PeaceWorks container shipment with great joy. Your gifts to them, and their gratitude, have created a lasting bond. *Thank you for participating in this priceless exchange.*
